

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

## ALL ENTRY FEES PAID OUT IN PRIZE MONEY

### PASSES FOR ATTENDANTS TO LIVESTOCK

Passes will be given out by the Secretary when entry fees are paid according to the amount of entry fees paid to the Society.

#### -CATTLE-

One to Five Animals ..... Two Passes  
Six and Over Animals ..... Three Passes

#### -SWINE AND SHEEP-

Over Ten Animals ..... Three Passes

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are required to read the following rules carefully and send in their entries as soon as possible. Be sure that all entry fees are sent with entry forms.

### ADMISSION TO THE GROUNDS

The price of admission for adults will be \$12.00 for each day and children 12 and under FREE. Weekend Packages can be obtained from the office or the gate. Cost of Weekend Package: \$30.00

### NO DOGS ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS.

### MEMBERSHIP

The membership fee is \$12.00 (Adult, 13 years and over). All exhibitors to purchase Membership Cards. Each Adult Exhibitor to receive a One Day Pass. If you wish to upgrade to a Weekend Package the cost is an additional \$10.

### JUDGING TO COMMENCE AT 9:00 A.M. FIRST DAY OF FAIR - AUGUST 29<sup>TH</sup>

### POULTRY & SHEEP - AUGUST 29<sup>TH</sup> BEEF CATTLE & SWINE - AUGUST 30<sup>TH</sup> DAIRY CATTLE - AUGUST 31<sup>ST</sup>

Only one bedding of straw supplied by Society.

It is desired that all entries be made on pre-printed forms, which may be obtained free of charge from the secretary or found in the prize list (see page 51/52 & 57/58). These forms, accompanied by all necessary fees, and to be filled out, including the indemnity release signed by the Exhibitor, and delivered to the Secretary by the appropriate date.

*ALL Poultry Entry Forms are due August 7<sup>TH</sup>  
(Poultry are classes 36 to 46 & Junior class J89)*

*All Other Entry Forms are due August 24<sup>TH</sup>  
(the Saturday before the fair)*

**No email entries will be accepted.  
Entries and indemnity releases may be faxed to the secretary. Faxed entries will be accepted until 8:00 p.m. on the day they are due.**

### ALL FEES MUST BE PAID BEFORE ENTRY TICKET WILL BE ISSUED!

All animals in the livestock classes must be the property of the exhibitor at the time of making the entry, except the draft pony hitch (each must own a team). Entry to be made in one exhibitor's name only.

All livestock exhibitors must provide proof of liability insurance.

Judges are particularly requested, in all cases, not to award premiums to any article or animal not worthy of a prize.

All horses and cattle must be tied up and other stock placed in position as directed by the committee in charge.

**Cattle, sheep and swine are not to be removed from barns before 4:00 p.m. on the last day. Poultry, rabbits, ducks, geese, and pigeons are not to be removed before 5:00 p.m. on the last day. Exhibitors not adhering to the above rules will forfeit their winnings.**

Livestock must be paraded before the Judges for examination. No interference with the Judges will be allowed during the examination.

*All articles in halls to be exhibited, must be in position by 9:00 p.m. on Wednesday.*

### NO ARTICLE TO BE REMOVED FROM MAIN HALL, ARTS & CRAFT BUILDING & SCOUT HALL BEFORE 5:00 P.M. ON THE LAST DAY!

The decision of the judge will be final. Appeals will not be considered. Exhibitors interfering with the judging will forfeit their winnings.

All exhibits must be picked up by their rightful owner unless otherwise arranged through the office. Persons picking up other exhibitors articles must sign for, and accept responsibility for these articles.

**-EXTRACT FROM BY-LAWS-**

Any member exhibiting an article not his bonafide property shall forfeit all prizes awarded at the Fair, and shall be prohibited from exhibiting for a period of two years. All Agricultural and Horticultural produce exhibited within the year in which the exhibition is held, except clover seed, soybeans and corn, and all manufactured articles must be manufactured by the exhibitor within the same period, and any exhibitor who shall be known to exhibit any article or product manufacture that is not his own production or manufacture, shall forfeit all prizes that he may be awarded at the Fair, and shall be precluded from exhibiting for a period of two years.

No prizes awarded to articles not mentioned in the Prize List.

In case there is a shortage of gate receipts, the Directors have decided to pay a percentage of the Prize Money instead of the full amount.

**NOTE:** No person shall be allowed to enter for exhibition more than two entries in any section of a class in the Exhibition Hall, unless otherwise stated; or more than two entries in cattle, sheep, poultry and hogs. - This rule does not apply to horses. - Any entry under an A.O.V. (any other variety) must be correctly named.

Any soiled, defaced or old work will not be judged .

Though the Board of Directors will take every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of articles sent for

exhibition, they wish it distinctly understood that the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them and should any exhibits be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, the Directors will give all assistance in their power toward the recovery of the same, but will not make payment for the value thereof.

***To collect your merchandise prizes for specials, please take the certificate you receive from the Harrow Fair (they are mailed with prize money cheques) to the business that sponsored the special.***

**For specials we have indicated which sections they pertain to.**

Any information collected by the Colchester South and Harrow Agricultural Society regarding members, exhibitors, commercial exhibitors, sponsors, directors and any other persons related directly to the business of the Colchester South and Harrow Agricultural Society and the Harrow Fair, will be solely used for the purposes of promotion of the Colchester South and Harrow Agricultural Society and the Harrow Fair, and for the maintenance of their files and data base. Any member, exhibitor, commercial exhibitor, sponsor or director realizes that when they agree to take part in the Colchester South and Harrow Agricultural Society and the Harrow Fair, that the names may be published for these reasons only. None of this information whatsoever will be sold or transferred to any outside party for any reason.

## HARROW FAIR - EXHIBITOR FACT SHEET

### Membership

Exhibitor membership (\$12.00) entitles you to enter no more than TWO entries in any section of each class in Exhibition Hall, unless otherwise stated, and ONE entry in any section for Arts & Crafts, Needle Arts and Photography.

Each exhibitor will receive a one-day pass. To upgrade to a weekend pass is an additional \$10. Juniors require a membership. (no charge)

If you are a Junior entering in an adult class you must purchase an adult membership. Junior is 12 years and under. You are not eligible for a pass.

Everyone will need to purchase a new membership every year.

### Prize Lists

The prize list will be available on the fair web site ([www.harrowfair.com](http://www.harrowfair.com)) and at select locations after July 15th.

### Entry Forms

All entries are to be made on the pre-printed forms accompanied by necessary fees (poultry).

\*Please read rules and regulations and sign entry form.

An entry form is enclosed with your Prize List. You may obtain pre-printed forms at the office and from the fair web site ([www.harrowfair.com](http://www.harrowfair.com)).

Entry forms are to be submitted by Saturday, August 24th, 2024 so that the tags may be prepared for you ahead of time. (see note below)

Poultry entry forms must be in by Wednesday, August 7th, 2024 (see note below)

Mail or Fax entry form early. No e-mail entries.

Entries will not be accepted after 8:00 pm Saturday, August 24th, 2024

### Entries

Entries must be placed in Main Hall, Arts & Craft Building, Lions (Scout) Hall & Poultry Barn between 10:00 am and 9:00 pm Wednesday, August 28th, 2024.

### Reclaiming Entries

You must reclaim your entries on Sunday, September 1st between 5:00 pm and 6:30 pm. (You may need your membership card.) Domestic Science reserves the right to discard moldy, bacteria laden exhibits.

### Prize Money

Prize money will be mailed to you approximately 4 weeks after the Fair. Please cash cheques promptly (by December 31st)

"Love songs, there's not much fault you can find in them, especially in the wholesome variety that we're singing about," says Tim Neufeld, the Tim part of the band that also includes Glory Boys Colin Trask (dobro/percussionist) and Brenton Thorvaldson (banjo/guitar).

Formed in 2013, Tim & The Glory Boys call their boot-stompin' feel-good sound "canoegrass," a nod to both their bluegrass roots and the rustic country Canadiana the band have more recently begun exploring to great success. It's a sound that would fit comfortably in a playlist paired together with Morgan Wallen, U2, Old Dominion, Billie Eilish and The Doobie Brothers.

Expect to hear a lot more canoegrass on Tim & The Glory Boys the band's new self-titled album. The major label debut full-length album for Sony Canada (April 21 release date) includes an astounding

five songs which have already hit the Top 40 at country radio and have generated almost 30 million streams worldwide. "When You Know You Know" has received gold certification for total listens, and three others – "Me Without You," "Without A Prayer" and the summertime smash "Float" – have all hit the Top Ten on radio with the promise of more to come. The two-time Juno Award winners have also become mainstays at the Canadian Country Music Association Awards, having been nominated in 2021 for Group of the Year and Rising Star, and again in 2022 for Group of the Year.

The band's heartwarming newest single (March 10 release date) "Take Me Backroad ft High Valley" should earn even more support for the Boys. Featuring a guest spot from High Valley's Brad Rempel, the song written by Rempel, Jon Nite (Luke Bryan, Keith Urban, Dierks Bentley) and Ben Stennis (Jason Aldean, Tim McGraw, Cody Johnson) is a joyful tale about getting back to one's happy place.



Italian Grape Cake using the following recipe.

## **Italian Grape Cake**

An incredibly moist cake made with olive oil and scented with orange zest, almond and a hint of thyme. It's an Italian-style harvest cake and a simple yet perfect way of baking with grapes.

### **Ingredients**

- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1/2 cup almond or wheat flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- pinch of salt
- 2 large eggs
- 2/3 cups granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1/3 cup almond milk or regular milk
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon pure almond extract
- orange zest from 1 medium orange
- 1 teaspoon thyme leaves optional
- 2 cups small seedless grapes such as Thomcord, Thompson or Concord (divided 1 cup in cake batter and 1 cup to scatter over top)
- 1/2 cup sliced almonds

### **Instructions**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Grease and flour a 9 inch springform pan.

1. In a medium sized bowl, sift together the all purpose flour, almond flour, baking powder and salt. Set aside.
2. In the bowl of a stand mixer or hand held mixer, fitted with the whisk attachment, beat together the eggs and granulated sugar until thick and pale yellow in colour. About 3 minutes.
3. Mix in the olive oil, milk, vanilla and almond

extracts, zest and thyme until well incorporated.

4. Switch to the paddle attachment and mix in the flour mixture until well combined.
5. Fold in 1 cup of the grapes with a rubber spatula.
6. Transfer the cake batter to the prepared pan and level off with the back of a spoon.
7. Scatter the remaining 1 cup of grapes evenly over the top of the cake.
8. Sprinkle the top of the cake with sliced almonds.
9. Bake the cake in a preheated oven for about 40 minutes.  
*When ready the cake will have a deep golden brown colour and springs back to the touch or if a toothpick inserted inside comes out clean, then it's ready.*
10. Remove from the oven and transfer to a cooling rack.
11. Run a knife alongside the edges of the pan and allow to cool for 30 minutes.
12. Release the cake from the springform pan and cool completely.
13. Can garnish with extra features such as sugared grapes, fresh thyme leaves or your feature of choice to make your cake stand out with the judges.

## **NOTES**

### **Ingredients for Sugared Grapes:**

- 3 small clusters of grapes on the vine or approximately 2/3 cups of plucked grapes
  - 1/3 cup granulated sugar plus 1/4 cup
  - 1/3 cup water
  - Simple Syrup
1. Place 1/3 cup of sugar and equal part water in a small stock pot.
  2. Heat on medium low and stir together till the sugar has completely dissolved.
  3. Remove from heat.
  4. With a slotted spoon, dip the grapes in the simple syrup mixture, turning to coat all over.
  5. Transfer to a wire rack and let the grapes dry for 1 hour.
  6. Roll the grapes in the remaining 1/4 cup of sugar while taking care to cover the grapes all over with the sugar.
  7. Return to the wire rack and let dry for another hour so that the sugar adheres to the grapes.

### **Gluten Free Flaky Pie Crust**

*Roll out your pie crust between layers of cling wrap, parchment or wax paper. Double this recipe if you need a bottom and top crust.*

*Prep Time: 1 hour hr 10 minutes*

*Servings: 1-9 in. pie crust*

*Author: Just As Good Gluten Free*

#### **Ingredients**

1 ½ cup 225 grams gluten free flour blend

½ teaspoon guar or xanthan gum omit if in blend

¼ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon sugar

5 Tbs cold unsalted butter frozen for ½ hour then grated with large holes

4 Tbs cold vegetable shortening cut into small cubes

¼ teaspoon apple cider vinegar

4-5 Tbs ice cold water

2 sheets of parchment wax or cling wrap, approx. 12 in. wide

#### **Instructions**

In a medium bowl, sift together gluten free flour, guar gum, salt and sugar. Add cold shredded butter and shortening cubes. Using a pastry blender, cut through the dough until small clumps form about the size of a pea or smaller. Alternatively, you can use your hands to do this if you do not have a pastry blender. Add ¼ teaspoon apple cider vinegar.

Add 3 Tbs ice cold water and use pastry blender until the water is incorporated. Add 1 TBS ice cold water, and this time use your hands to turn over the dough. If all of your flour has not stuck to a ball, add another 1 Tbs ice cold water. Continue rolling the dough into a ball until all the flour mixture is combined and the ball is nice and smooth. Be careful not to add too much water as this will make the dough very tacky and too sticky.

Shape the dough into a disc (approx. 6 inches in diameter) and place the dough on a piece of parchment paper or wax or cling wrap. Cover the top of the dough with another piece of parchment, wax or cling wrap. Note: I like to use parchment on the bottom because it is wider than standard cling wrap. I then use cling wrap on the top so I can easily see the dough, gently lifting the cling wrap as needed to cover the dough as I'm rolling.

Using a rolling pin, begin gently pressing and rolling from the center of the dough out to the edge. Each time you press and roll, slightly rotate the crust (think of a clock and rolling out every 5 minute increments). Continue this until your dough is approximately 11-12 inches in diameter and you have a nice, even layer of pie dough. Carefully remove the cling wrap.

Use the bottom parchment sheet to help you gently turn your pie dough into your 9 inch pie plate. Gently press the dough down into the plate and crimp the edges as desired. If you have any tears in the dough, simply press the dough and it will go back together. Cut off any excess pie dough hanging over the edge. Loosely cover the pie dough with plastic wrap and freeze for 30 minutes or refrigerate for 1 hour.

Remove from refrigerator and fill your pie dough with desired ingredients and bake according to whatever your recipe states.
